A course for people with a disability interested in taking part in committees or having a say in the community.

This series of short courses empowers participants with a disability to:

- Have a say in the community
- Create positive change
- Be a voice for people with disabilities
- Contribute in either paid and voluntary capacities, and
- Gain accredited competencies in leadership

What will I learn in this short course?

During the course you will learn about:

- effective team membership
- the different roles in a committee
- responsibilities of committee members
- the process and protocols of meetings
- the benefits of diversity in committees
- the value of community service
- effective ways to express opinions and influence decision making
- the functions of government
- current local issues
- rights and responsibilities of citizenship
- things that influence public policy

This short course is part of a four part Leadership program which makes up a Certificate I in Leadership Development (52183).

When does it run?

The short course runs every Monday for 5 weeks starting Monday 23 April 2012.

The class begins at 9:30am and finishes at 3:00pm.

How much does it cost?

Fees vary depending on your individual circumstances such as whether you have completed an accredited course before and your concession status. For those eligible for a Victorian Government subsidised place tuition fees including lunch and materials range from \$249 to \$277.
